Dear Ministers and Mr. Emon,

The Ontario Federation of Agriculture (OFA) is Canada's largest voluntary general farm organization, representing more than 36,000 farm family businesses across Ontario. These farm businesses form the backbone of a robust food system and rural communities with the potential to drive the Ontario economy forward.

The spread of wild parsnip throughout Eastern Ontario poses a threat not only to agricultural operations but also to humans as contact with the leaves can result in severe skin irritation.



The Ontario Government deemed wild parsnip to be a significant problem and so added it to the Noxious Weeds list in 2015, to facilitate its control. As a noxious weed, the control of wild parsnip is an obligation of land owners across Ontario.

On behalf of all Ontarians, I urge you to take action to address wild parsnip on lands under your jurisdiction. We further urge Ontario's weed inspectors to utilize their authority under the Weed Control Act to facilitate the destruction of wild parsnip on private property.
