FUEL COSTS



Ontario Fuel Tax must be paid at the time of fuel purchase; on gasoline at 14.7¢/litre, and clear fuel or blended biodiesel fuel at 14.3¢/litre.

Farmers may purchase coloured fuel tax-free for use in their unlicensed farm equipment. Coloured diesel fuel is exempt from the 14.3¢/litre Ontario Fuel Tax and should normally sell below clear diesel fuel by roughly that amount. Some additional handling costs for coloured may affect the difference.

LIVESTOCK – VETERINARY CONCERNS



Health Canada is taking steps to help combat antimicrobial resistance by prohibiting the sale of medically-important antimicrobial (MIA) drugs over-the-counter through licenced Livestock Medical Outlets. Starting December 1, 2018, all livestock producers will need a prescription from a licenced veterinarian in order to purchase a medically-important antimicrobial for use in livestock production, including any medicated feed that includes an antimicrobial. All producers will need to have a valid veterinarian-client-patientrelationship established prior to obtaining prescriptions for MIAs.
