Applications must include:

- \$55.00 non-refundable fee for administrative and material costs.

- A sketch or site plan of the property, identifying the existing access point location(s) with distance to and in context with property line(s).

The applicant must be the property owner or otherwise include a letter from the property owner designating the applicant as the property owner's acting agent.

PEFA was proud to nominate the late Grant Howes of County Cider Co. and he was inducted in September 2019. Grant was instrumental in the creation of a successful commercialized cider industry in Ontario. He pioneered planting cider and heritage apples varieties in Ontario for cider making. He was a founding member of the Fruit Wines of Ontario, the Prince Edward County Winegrowers Association and the Ontario Craft Cider Association. He was an advisor the Niagara College Winery Program during its first year and taught for one semester at Loyalist College in the Wine Technology Program. Reduced Truck Load Season

By-law 2406-2009 has allowed for perishable and contracted commodities to be trucked on County Roads when needed. Operators must obtain a \$200 permit AND provide a \$2000 deposit that will be returned at the end of the season.

To get your permit: email operations@pecounty.on.ca & ask for the "Annual Oversized Load Permit Application"
