The Security from Trespass and Protecting Food Safety Act, 2020 protects Ontario farm animals, farms, farmers and their families, agri-food employees, and the safety of the entire food supply by addressing the ongoing threat of unwanted trespassing and from unauthorized interactions with farm animals. The Act strikes an important balance, respecting the right to peaceful public protest, while giving the justice system the tools it needs to help protect farmers, agri-food workers and businesses, and the food supply from trespassing and harassment. ### ISSUE to WATCH: MZOs

OFA has expressed deep concerns to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing regarding the recent proliferation of Minister's Zoning Orders for municipalities with robust planning systems, Official Plans and Zoning By-Laws. It deprives impacted citizens of the ability to be consulted on the proposed amendments to these Ministry approved Plans and By-Laws. Certain Minister's Zoning Orders seem to ignore the application of key criteria and considerations such as Minimum Distance Separation and whether the proposed development can be accommodated through intensification, redevelopment and the completion of Agricultural Impact Assessments in designated growth areas. OFA is clearly opposed to the planning process being bypassed with these orders from Minister Clark.
