Notes from OFA Contario of The Art of Influence

In response to the recent Auditor General and Integrity Commissioner's reports, there was a flurry media on the subject.

It may seem like we were quiet. That was intentional. Interviews would have dragged us into a political hotspot, one that would have likely pushed us to speak against one party or the premier, or the minister. Doing such things gives you one shot, one bang, and then you pay for a long time... OFA is better to think about the long game and stick to the issue - use excellent long term land use planning and protect farmland inside and outside of the Greenbelt. OFA is seeking a meeting with the new Minister, Paul Calandra. A new minister gives us a new chance to speak up at MMAH. He has already been vocal that he still wants to build houses. We are

not against housing, but want it to be located in the right places. We know that we have been quiet so far, we want to give him a chance - in a sense, lay our cards on the table. Do we know that this will be successful? No. But it is a first step.

We understand the needs of our membership -by being quiet, it could be suggested that we are bending to government. This was evident by PAC concerns. We need to remind our membership of our strong stance to protect farmland.

It may feel frustrating to sit back, but it does help us with political conversations. (It is a tightrope that we walk...)


Northumberland Farmers Inducted to Wall of Fame

A Valuable Tool for Telling Agriculture's Economic Story.

In 1991, Hon. Ralph Ferguson (M.P.) had his staff prepare a document to illustrate the share of the consumer's dollar that farmers received. The resulting document was donated to the Centre for Rural Studies and Enrichment at St. Peter's College in Muenster, Saskatchewan.

As demand dictated, it was updated in 1999, and again in 2004 with financial support from the Ontario Federation of Agriculture (OFA).

The latest document provides graphic illustrations of how the gap between the price consumers pay and the price farmers receive for the food they produce has widened. It also shows how prices have increased for the goods and

services farmers have to buy as inputs for their farming operations.

The document also provides a graph (Page 4) that illustrates the percentage of disposable income spent on food in a number of nations. On Page 16, users of the document can find a graph that shows how off-farm income has increased over the year, and on Pate 17, another graph illustrates the growth of farm debt.
