# COCS STUDY IN PEC

PEFA and OFA worked with the municipality to complete a Cost of Community Service (COCS) study. These studies were developed by the American Farmland Trust in the mid1980s and break a municipality's land base into several distinct categories, then allocate all municipal revenues/expenditures to these land use categories. They're a 'snapshot in time' of each category's fiscal impact on a municipality in a year. The results of the study are below, using 2020 data. The farm/forest ratio of 0.71 tells us, for <u>every dollar</u> of municipal revenue generated by the category, the municipality spent \$0.71 providing services to that category. PEFA will use this data in future meetings with the county.

# NOXIOUS WEED STRATEGY

PEFA's Directors have been discussing the concerning trend of rapidly spreading noxious weeds, across the county. Our goal is to raise awareness of the issue and present strategies to County Council for dealing with them more effectively in the future.



We are asking farmers for their help in two ways:

1) Report large swaths of noxious weeds to the municipality through the *Have Your Say* website. Reporting is the best way to draw the county's attention to the scale of the issue.

2) Remove your Farm Business Registration number from farm properties you are no longer renting. Landowners who are allowing land to go fallow may still be receiving a tax break based on previous year's paperwork. Call MPAC to remove your number.
